KLF acquires food through generous donations and pennies-on-the-dollar purchasing.



KLF distributes food to 71 locations in their food-assistance network.



KLF offers direct service at 24 pantry sites five days per week and manages a volunteer force utilizing 450 volunteers per week.

The Grocery Pantry Program (GPP) is KLF's largest and longest-running program serving Kalamazoo County.

At 24 pantry sites throughout the county, local residents receive same-day appointments in which they can choose four day's worth of food for each individual household member. Food is based on the USDA's MyPlate guidelines, providing nutritionally balanced choices that include protein, grains, and fruits and vegetables.

During busy periods, KLF can see more than 1000 local residents-in-need utilize the GPP program in a single day.

The organization has additional anti-hunger programs so food can further-reach vulnerable populations.
