MEET LEEANNE

Leeanne moved to Kalamazoo in early 2023 to be closer to medical facilities. "I have been battling breast cancer for about a year, and some days I am just too weak to drive." Leeanne continues to share that she is self-employed, so money has been tight since her cancer diagnosis. In her grocery order, KLF includes easy to prepare meals, lots of fresh produce, and protein shakes to help provide nutrition on days where Leeanne is struggling with fatigue and nausea. "I moved to Kalamazoo because of medical care, and I thought it would be a good area for my business. Finding Loaves & Fishes and your delivery program has been so helpful on the days when I don't feel good."

MEET ERNESTO

Ernesto, a single dad of one child, contacted KLF to see if he would be eligible for help. "I lost my job a few months ago. Totally unexpected. I've had several job interviews recently — I hope I will get offered one soon." Ernesto continues to say that he doesn't have extra money for bus fare or gas for his car and wonders if he can get a delivery. "I'm saving everything I have so I can pay my rent next month," he shares. "Once I get a job, I should be okay for a while, but this has been a real rough patch in my life. I've had a lot of sleepless nights wondering how we will make it through this. "

MEET WHITNEY

Whitney and her husband are in their mid-30s and both work full-time. They are the parents of two children, ages 17 and 2. "Even though we both have jobs, we are really struggling financially," shares Whitney when she first reaches out about KLF services. "Everything keeps getting more expensive, but our paychecks aren't getting much bigger to keep up." With 26% of KLF's clients employed full-time, Whitney and her husband are not alone. Whitney originally schedules a grocery pick-up on a night when KLF has evening hours, however, calls to reschedule for the next day. "I don't have enough gas to get there, but I have no money until I get paid tomorrow." Whitney states. "I know you offer delivery, but I don't mind picking up. I just can't do it until I get paid and can afford to fill up my tank."



Our Mobile Food Distributions offer a convenient way for anyone to receive extra grocery items. The program offers regularly scheduled monthly distributions at 10 locations throughout Kalamazoo County. These drivethru style distributions do not require an appointment and supply each household with 5–7 supplemental food items. We spoke with Marcia Royer about her experience as the Distribution Site Coordinator at Sunnyside United Methodist Church on Gull Road.

Q: When did you begin working with KLF, and what do you enjoy about your role as a Distribution Site Coordinator?

A: I have worked within the Sunnyside pantry for about 11 years. It is a great opportunity to be involved with the community. I work with a great team of volunteers who are experienced professionals, very warm and caring. This work offers us an opportunity to do good for others, and I appreciate seeing the differences between people in our community and the impact of our work.

Q: Your location at Sunnyside has shifted from a pantry into a Mobile Food Distribution site. What was that change like?

The pandemic drove the change from pantry to a mobile distribution site. We had to rework the model but did not get discouraged. It is always a team effort, so we review what works well, or what needs to be changed. Communication and sharing of ideas help us to serve up to 72 households during each distribution.

Q: What would you say to someone who is interested in visiting a mobile food distribution for the first time?

A: I would encourage them to find out the details of a distribution site, and feel free to ask questions. We operate based on self-declaration of need, so there are no barriers to receiving food. We work to keep up relationships with local families, and we serve everyone with dignity.

This summer we have welcomed a few new faces to our team!

Ashley Clark and Shymeria Stone help with daily operations as Program Assistants. They assist in the Melzer Pantry, support clients and donors at our Caseworker Door, and work closely with volunteers.

We've also hired Eddie Lewis as a Warehouse Assistant. Eddie contributes to the movement and functions within our warehouse and has been a great addition to the group!



Donor Advised Funds (DAF)

Looking for a simple and tax-advantageous way of managing your charitable giving? A donor-advised fund, or DAF, may be right for you! A DAF serves as a charitable investment account to support the non-profit organizations that are important to you.

How it works:

- Establish a DAF with a sponsoring organization such as a community foundation or a financial service company like Fidelity, Schwab or Vanguard.
- 2. Make a donation to the DAF of cash, stocks, or non-publicly traded assets.
- 3. Receive a tax deduction at time of donation to the DAF.
- 4. Support any IRS-qualified public charity with grant recommendations from your DAF. The sponsoring organization of the DAF will send the gift directly to the charity of your selection. The charity will be notified that the gift is from you.
- 5. Give at your pace you can determine how much and when gifts are distributed from your DAF immediately or over time.

The Challenge of Affordable Housing

Personal financial experts recommend spending no more than 30% of one's total income on housing. While this may be possible for some, **it is difficult for many families to find safe, affordable housing** that also allows for other necessities such as food, medical care, transportation, or childcare.

According to census.gov, the median gross rent in the city of Kalamazoo from 2017-2021 was \$869. For this to be 30% of an individual's monthly income, they would need to bring in around \$2,900 per month or nearly \$35,000 per year. While these figures are recent, those who have searched for rental housing in Kalamazoo would tell you it is very difficult to find available units in this price range. With recent inflation, Zillow now estimates the median rent to be \$1,200 per month. And for many families, it is just not feasible.

For those looking to buy a home rather than rent, the past few years have made it increasingly difficult due to rising costs. Data from the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis shows that from the

first quarter of 2020 to the fourth quarter of 2022, the median home sales price rose 46% from \$329,000 to \$479,500, among the fastest rate of median home sales price increases in U.S. history. With inflation and effects of the pandemic still taking shape, it is predicted that housing will likely remain unaffordable for some, particularly those in lower-income households.

The U.S. Government Accountability Office found that a \$100 increase in median rent was associated with a 9% increase in the estimated homelessness rate, and this is after accounting for other relevant factors, such as wages, unemployment rate, and poverty. Thankfully, there are some assistance programs available for renters and homeowners in Michigan, although many have specific requirements and strict deadlines. Organizations in Kalamazoo County continue to advocate for more affordable housing options as well. Meanwhile, KLF will continue to provide grocery assistance to anyone in need, which for many, means having the ability to pay their housing costs and keep a roof over their head.
