PAUL'S STORY

Paul comes to Kalamazoo Loaves & Fishes' pantry prepared. He's a middle-aged man who prides himself on knowing what he has to do to stay healthy and organized. He places his reusable shopping bags in his grocery cart and strikes up a friendly conversation with the volunteer assisting him. As he sets a carton of fresh eggs and a package of fresh breakfast sausage in his basket, he comments that he's excited to cook sausage and eggs before he heads to work in the evening.

"I'm on disability due to an illness," Paul shares, "but I still contribute, I still want to do my part if I can." He works five nights a week washing dishes at a popular local eatery. He loves his job and gushes about his managers, how they offer free meals to employees, but he often has to turn them down due to health reasons. "I'm a diabetic so I can't eat heavy-carb food and, a lot of the time, that's what they're dishing out during our breaks."

Paul's concern for his health is apparent while he's shopping at KLF. He bypasses pastas, breads and juice drinks and makes a beeline for fresh protein, whole grains and produce. He's also conscious of taking no more than he thinks he'll use. "I can't have sweets, so I love fresh fruit," Paul explains, "And I love soul food. I'm from Memphis, so I love to cook home-style food."

Paul moved to Kalamazoo a number of years ago to help care for his ailing mother. He found it tough to get on his feet, but finally saved enough money



to get his own apartment. "I was living with my brother, and I was grateful for his help, but there's nothing like having your own place." He also expresses gratitude for KLF's services because, at times, it's the only access he has to the fresh foods that keep him healthy.

With two bags of groceries in hand, Paul makes his way toward the door while giving a friendly nod to KLF staff and volunteers. He has a 20-minute walk home ahead of him, but he walks a little lighter knowing sausage and eggs are on the menu.

NOTE FROM JEN

Imagine stepping foot into a food pantry for the first time. It could be because you recently lost your job and had to make the daunting choice between buying groceries or paying the mortgage. Perhaps you're suddenly caring for grandkids and your typical grocery budget, which was barely meeting the needs of one individual, cannot sustain you as well as others. Maybe you were recently diagnosed with an illness that requires a specialized diet, one that includes more fresh food and, for as long as you can remember, your limited budget couldn't afford such luxuries. It's for these reasons that Kalamazoo Loaves & Fishes (KLF) works every day to ensure that, for the people who need our services, tough choices are left at the door.

Our Grocery Pantry Program provides food based on USDA nutritional categories. While we always have these options available in non-perishable form, we also make them available in the form of fresh meat, dairy products, eggs, and fresh produce. We're lucky to have dedicated gleaners who visit local grocery stores on a weekly basis to pick up items like bread and produce. We also have committed food industry donors who often astonish us with donations of fresh meat, eggs, milk and produce when we need them most. More often than not, fresh food is the first thing that needs restocking in our pantries because people with limited food budgets can't afford to shop for more expensive perishable items.



Much like a grocery store, our pantry shelves and coolers are stocked with a variety of products to fit the needs of the diverse clientele we serve. We strive to provide people with choices and we're thrilled that, at

the end of a busy pantry day, our shelves tell the story of a community that appreciates having access to an array of

options.



COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT: THE ONSTAFF GROUP

Since its inception in 1985, The OnStaff Group has always focused on people in our community. Whether you are a job seeker or a hiring professional, OnStaff provides comprehensive, customized human resource services to

make rewarding employment matches.

But in 2011, OnStaff turned the spotlight on something else – childhood hunger. It all



began when Executive Vice President, Emily Turner, was having a conversation with her young daughter, Hannah. To get a "vacation" from wearing school uniforms for a day, Hannah and her classmates were encouraged to bring food items for Kalamazoo Loaves & Fishes. Hannah was shocked to learn that there were children in the community who didn't have food to eat. She pleaded with her mom to help do something about childhood hunger. And from that conversation, the annual OnStaff Dollar Drive Thru was born.

The concept was simple – encourage people to donate just one dollar to help with childhood hunger during summer months. OnStaff turned to their friends at 107.7 WRKR for help. Rocker morning show hosts Mike McKelly and Stefani Bishop were quickly on board and now, each July, the Rocker broadcasts live for 12 hours and encourages listeners to "drive thru" one of several locations around town to donate. The OnStaff Dollar Drive-Thru has raised nearly \$35,000 since inception to alleviate childhood hunger in Kalamazoo County.

Brandon Jeannot, Operations Manager, shared, "At OnStaff Group we come in contact with over 10,000 job seekers a month. Through their personal stories we are acutely aware of the needs of many in our community. We are proud to be an active community partner supporting many worthy organizations."

All food at KLF goes through a rigorous inventory process; it's sorted into one of 16 categories, checked for quality, inputted into a computer inventory system, and then stored or assigned to one of four KLF programs. From there, KLF's 24 pantries can order exactly what they need

THE STATE OF FOOD WASTE

A report released late last year estimates that the United States tosses an average \$162 billion in food per year. The New York Times also reports that one third of the edible food the world produces is never consumed and reducing food waste by 20 to 50 percent globally could save \$120-\$300 billion per year by 2030. The amount of food tossed each year could feed the over 800 million people struggling with food insecurity, and when you take into account the amount of water, resources, and labor that goes into food production, we're wasting far more than sustenance.

Oftentimes, the food being tossed is still edible. Confusion about food *Sell By* and *Best By* dates compounds the problem, and the result is 32 million metric tons on food rotting in landfills each year.
